Epiphany, also called Theophany, is a Christian feast day which falls on 6 January

(Twelfth Night) and is a celebration of how God revealed Himself to the world in Jesus. This Holy Day celebrates how a star led the Magi - also known as the Three Kings or the Wise Men - to visit Jesus after he had been born bringing gifts to signify who he was and what he would do.

#### Eco Church

As an Eco Church with a Bronze Eco Award, we are now striving to gain a Silver Award. To help towards this we need to encourage everybody to take action together as a church, we also have an individual responsibility to take action in our daily lives so that we tread lightly on the Earth, and use our voices to speak up for nature. To further this, a monthly Eco Tip will be published in our Weekly News Sheet. I do hope it will encourage you to act.

#### Christmas cards

In the UK we send about <u>150 million</u> Christmas cards a year. Sending just one card produces <u>140 grams of carbon dioxide</u>; although that will lessen as the Royal Mail expands its electric vehicle fleet. That's equivalent to powering 200 average UK homes for a whole year.

Just making a few tweaks to how you send out your greetings this year could make a difference. From making sure you choose 100% recyclable cards, avoid glitter (it ends up in landfill), and delivering on foot where you can. Emails, e-cards or phone calls are much lower carbon options for friends that live abroad.

Sign the communal Christmas card, available at the back of the church. Money in lieu of cards and postage will be gladly received for our chosen environmental charity.

### Following the Fire Risk Assessment, there need to be recognised 'Fire Wardens' to support fire safety at St John's.

There is an on-line Fire Warden Information Package, and we look forward to your support in becoming aware of what action is necessary to assist each other in the event of a fire. The information package will be completed by Alan Gordon (Caretaker): Lyn Brown (Church Secretary); the Leadership Team: Property Team; Members of the Circuit Team based at St John's; Church Stewards and all those who perform the role of Door Stewards. Anyone else who would be interested are also welcome to attend. The package is on-line and takes about 2 hours to view everything. This Fire Warden Information Package is suitable for everyone and no previous knowledge required. It offers an overview of fire safety in the workplace, including the causes of fire, risk assessments, fire prevention measures and, most importantly, the key expectations of fire wardens. By following this package, you will gain the necessary knowledge to help prevent fires, ensure safe evacuation during emergencies and protect St John's from the potentially devastating consequences of fire. It is proposed to hold a joint session in the Fellowship Room on Monday 09<sup>th</sup> December 13.00 to 16.00pm and / or Wednesday 11th 13.00 - 15.40pm. Light refreshments will be provided at the end of the sessions. Alternatively, you can view the package at home. The cost, £42 including VAT, will be reimbursed.
